## TEE SELECTION KEY

- YELLOW** Farthest forward with shortest distance to the hole, and least challenging. Good for ladies and seniors.
  
- RED** Traditional women's tee. Also a good option for some seniors.
  
- WHITE** Standard tee for most adult men.
  
- BLUE** Expert tees. Mostly used by men and for championship and tournament play.
  
- GREEN** Courses we highly recommend.

# GAME OPTIONS

## **STROKE**

Play up to 6 people at a time and rank will be decided based on the final score.

## **PAR 3 GAME**

Play par 3 courses and rank is decided on the final score.

## **3 BALL**

Three players play for 1:1:1 match game.

## **4 BALL**

Four players form 2 teams and each player will make a shot with a ball for each player to play match game.

## **SCRAMBLE**

Choose the best shot from the first stroke and use the same spot for each player.

## **SKINS**

Prize will be assigned for each hole and player who wins the hole wins the prize.

## **SINGLE**

Two players play for 1:1 match game.

## **THREESOME**

Three players play for a 1:2 match game.

## **FOURSOME**

Four players form 2 teams and each team takes a shot alternatively using 1 ball to play match game.

# KNOW YOUR NUMBERS

## **DISTANCE**

Total distance the ball traveled.

## **CARRY**

The distance the ball traveled in the air before it landed.

## **BALL SPEED**

The speed the ball traveled. This is created by club speed and impact. The faster the club speed and centerness of the hit are the two main determining factors that will dictate ball speed.

## **BALL DIRECTION**

This is the angle between the target line and ball path at launch. If you see "0" then your ball is traveling directing along the target line at launch.

## **LAUNCH ANGLE**

The angle between the ball path and ground at launch. Swing speed and club selection will impact the launch angle as well as the angle of attack. For example, the average driver launch angle on the PGA Tour is 11.2 degrees.

## **BACK SPIN**

The rate of backwards spin rotation on the ball immediately after impact. Spin rate is one of the least appreciated numbers in windy conditions. Typically, the more lofted the club, the more spin generated. This is why when playing in the wind we often club up.

## **SIDE SPIN**

The rate of side spin on the ball. Depending on the amount of degrees will dictate a draw or fade.

## **IMPACT ANGLE**

This is the direction the club is heading at impact. Positive numbers indicate "in-to-out" for right hand golfers but negative numbers indicate "in-to-out" for left handers.

## **PEAK VERTICAL**

Maximum height the ball reached during its flight.

## **PEAK HORIZONTAL**

This measures how far the ball traveled before it reached its maximum height.

## **SEPARATION DISTANCE**

How far from the center line the shot ended up.

## **HEAD SPEED**

The rate of your club head speed at impact. More club speed means more potential distance.

## **SMASH FACTOR**

The ratio between club speed and ball speed – literally ball speed divided by club speed. Smash factor is an indicator of how efficiently energy is transferred from the club head to the ball. There is an optimal smash factor for each club, ranging from a driver at 1.50 to a pitching wedge at 1.25.
